THE CITY

Holland's oldest and most southerly city that strategically straddles the border with Belgium and Germany,
Maastricht, can trace its history back to when the Romans fortified the then tiny town on the banks of the great Maas River. Its impressive old buildings that stand several storeys high around Vrijthof, a busy square in its Old Town, still hint at its years of importance.

Maastricht is a multi-cultural city, largely because of its population of students that study at its university faculties, and the fact that it is a significant centre for business and industry – it is known worldwide for ceramics and papermaking. The city is also a centre of government, and the Treaty on European Union was signed by the heads of government in the city in February 1992.

The area is best explored on foot, especially if you want to study the statues and sculptures that adorn the streets.

Maastricht offers lots for visitors to see and do, among the must-sees' are the fortifications, the Old Town and its St Servaasbasiliek monument, the Gothic St Janskerk and the city's oldest building, the Onze Lieve Vrouwebasiliek.

Along with experiencing Stokstraat – a picturesque street of tempting shops and galleries – visitors ought to check out Wyck and Céramique-Wijk on the modern Right Bank.

Remember that many tourist attractions and museums are closed on Mondays.

Eating is a serious business in Maastricht. Breakfasts of cinnamon cake or fresh bread sprinkled with candy or chocolate is followed by lunch of traditional snacks such as uitsmijter – fresh bread with meat or cheese topped by fried eggs.

Afternoons comprise of pastries or poffertjes, mini-pancakes with butter and sugar, with coffee and then borrel, the time given to tasting a local beer or taking a nip of a local spirit with savoury finger food such as bitterballen or kroketten, two local delicacies.

Finally, dinner comprises a variety of substantial meals of vegetables, meat, chicken and fish, with a tasty dessert. Most restaurants in Maastricht follow this pattern, although, as with any city, there are international cuisine eateries to be found, especially those serving French dishes.

Maastricht is renowned throughout Holland as the place to shop. In the city centre, head for Stokstraat, a pedestrianised area surrounded by restored 17th- and 18th-century houses that host upmarket shops selling everything from art, jewellery and leather ware to designer fashions. Or make for Vrijthof square in the Old Town, where there are department stores and smaller shops such as antiques specialists and confectioners.

On the East Bank, Wyck and the Céramique-Wijk areas are known for their good fashion houses, delis selling all manner of pastries and savoury finger food, and antiques shops. All the shopping areas tend to sell the pretty ceramics for which Maastricht is famed.

There are markets held throughout Maastricht on almost every day of the week, two of the largest are the general market held in the Market Square on Wednesday and Friday mornings, and a food market on Thursdays in Stationstraat. Both areas become bustling centres for conversation and are an experience for the visitor to the city. If bargains are sought, then Maastricht's large flea market is held every Saturday in Stationstraat.



Taxi

Taxis are available from the airport and rail station, or by telephone. It is not allowed to hail a taxi on the street. Please note that taxi is not a common form of transport and is therefore quite expensive. It is also good to know that the drivers often not accept short fares.


