THE ISLAND

Zakynthos lost much of its centuries-old Venetian architecture to an earthquake in 1953, but Zakynthos Town retains a distinctly Italian feel, with arcaded streets, a wide central piazza and a scattering of grand old buildings. Above the town, a ruined – but still forbidding – Venetian castle looks eastward to the mainland and the Gulf of Corinth. Zakynthos's hilly hinterland can be explored in a rented car, though the island has few visitor attractions as such apart from a handful of small, but historic churches and two small museums.

Like most Greek holiday islands, Zakynthos really comes to life between May – when the first charter flights arrive – and October, when the last package holidaymakers depart. From October through to April, almost every hotel and nightspot on the island closes, and the resorts go into hibernation. Make the most of your summer on Zakynthos with the easy going, laid back beach life by day and party by night.

BEACH LIFE

Zakynthos has a surprisingly large amount of beautiful beaches, considering that the island is relatively small.

Alykes

On an east-facing bay, Alykes is midway along the northeast coast of the island and has a long sandy beach, plenty of water sports facilities, a good choice of tavernas and bars, and a handful of small discos. Usually less crowded than Laganas.

Argassi

Argassi's north-facing beach is less impressive than those of its island rivals, but it makes up for it with an impressive choice of water sports and facilities for families. The word on the street is that it's due to take over from Laganas as the island's nightlife hot spot.

Kalamaki

Separated from Laganas by a 5 km stretch of beach designated as part of the National Marine Park (and as such, free of buildings), Kalamaki is less raucous than its near neighbour and is more appealing to families and couples. It shares the same marvellous sands and striking views, and, like Laganas, is very close to the airport.

Laganas

This superb beach – a 14 kilometre long stretch of sand that runs, almost uninterrupted, from Geraki (also called Gerakas) at the southeast tip of the island to Laganas and beyond – is one of the last nesting grounds of the endangered loggerhead turtle (Caretta caretta). Parts of Laganas Bay and the beach have been designated as a National Marine Park to protect egg-laying females and hatchling turtles.

Powered water sports are banned within the waters of the NMP. Laganas is the island's biggest and noisiest resort, with dozens of pubs, bars and clubs.

Tsilivi

This resort lies around 6 km north of Zakynthos Town, and has grown from being a small fishing village, less than 20 years ago, to a full-scale holiday resort. The beach is long and sandy, with stunning views east to the mainland, and there is plenty of mid-range and budget accommodation. Tsilivi also has a good choice of places to eat and drink, and its nightlife is a good deal less frenzied than Laganas.

Vassilikos

Close to the southeast tip of Zakynthos and looking west across Laganas Bay, Vassilikos is one of the most attractive and peaceful of the island's beach resorts, with some of the best hotels on Zakynthos.

DO & SEE

For most visitors, the main attractions are Zakynthos's beaches – which include some of the very best in Greece – and it is cheap, cheerful with an unsophisticated nightlife.

Church of Agios Dionysios

This small church, built in 1925, contains the silver-encrusted sarcophagus of St. Dionysios, the island's patron saint. It survived the 1953 earthquake – proof, say devout islanders, of the Saint's miraculous powers. More Info: South side of Zakynthos Town harbour

Post-byzantine Museum

The main attraction here is the collection of fine Orthodox icons and wall-paintings from the churches and monasteries that were levelled by the earthquake in 1953. A model of Zakynthos Town prior to the quake shows what the town looked like pre-1953.

Solomos Museum

This modest museum celebrates the life and works of Dionysios Solomos, the Zakynthian author and poet who penned the Greek national anthem, along with other notable islanders.

Monitis Panagias (monastery of The Virgin)

Virtually the only historic building left standing intact on the island, this monastery near the northwest tip of the island was the home of St Dionysios, who, before being canonized, was the abbot here during the 17th century. His cell, with his few possessions, can still be viewed.

Round The Island Cruises

Excursion boats leave daily (buy tickets the night before at the quayside or at your hotel) from all the island resorts in summer. They take trips to the Blue Grotto, a marine cave carved out of the white limestone cliffs by thousands of years of wave action, and to the so-called I Smugglers Wreck' – the rusting hulk of a Syrian cargo vessel that ran aground in the 1980's on a spectacular white beach overlooked by towering cliffs – it is almost impossible to reach except by sea.

Ancient Olympia

The spectacular ruins of ancient Olympia, birthplace of the Olympic Games, are located only an hour away from Killini, the small port on the Greek mainland opposite Zakynthos. There are several ferries and hydrofoils daily in summer, taking around 90 minutes, so a day trip is possible.

Travel agents in Zakynthos also offer escorted coach tours to Olympia.

DINING

Greeks understand good food and they truly take their time to appreciate it. You could say eating is a national pastime in Greece, and some typical dishes from a Greek table could be tzatziki, seafood, olives, cheese, fresh meat and vegetables.

Zakynthos' resorts are not short of cheerful, affordable and family-run places to eat. Like night spots, restaurants and tavernas in the island's resorts may appear for a couple of seasons, then vanish when the lease runs out or when they fail to make a profit – so last summer's favourite diner may not be there on your next trip.

Olympic Cuisine Bar

This is an exclusive restaurant with an elegant feel. The menu contains traditional Greek cuisine, international dishes and Mediterranean inspired food. They use only ingredients of the highest quality and the chef strives to capture the warmth of the sun in his creations - fresh, light and pure.

Laganas is the raucous epicentre of Zakynthos' nightlife – rocking until dawn from May until September – with more than 50 clubs, music bars and pubs. But the other resorts, especially Argassi, have plenty of nightlife to offer, too. Names, management, music and door policy may change from season to season, but a hard core of well-established stalwarts can be relied on.

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Rescue Club

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Zakynthos International Airport

Zakynthos Airport is midway between Kalamaki and Laganas. It is around 1 km (10 minutes by coach or five minutes by taxi) from each area.

There is no public transport from the airport, though plenty of taxis meet each flight.

In addition to summer charter flights, there are several daily flights to Athens.
