Genova: the birthplace of Christopher Columbus and Paganini, Italy's biggest port and, as Charles Dickens remarked in 1844, "A city of the strangest contrasts." Renaissance palaces, grand 19th-century boulevards and gilded Baroque churches are squeezed alongside, and on top of, a warren of steep medieval streets. Fine restaurants and chic bars are hidden in the dark, narrow alleys. With one of the biggest universities in Italy, Genova's student population guarantees a buzzing nightlife.

Genova and Liguria are famous for pesto, the delicious pasta sauce made from basil, pine nuts, olive oil and parmesan. If you think you know pesto because you buy it in a jar – think again. There is nothing that compares to a dish of fresh vivid-green pesto served with the local pasta, little twists of trofie or spaghetti-like trenette. Other specialities include farinata, a bread-like snack made from chickpeas, foccacia, fish dishes, (particularly salt cod -baccalà) mushroom dishes and stuffed meat dishes. Plan to eat out in Genova. Many restaurants are closed on Sunday and Saturday lunchtime.

### Public Transport

Walking is the only form of transport possible in the historic centre of Genova – the streets are too narrow for cars. The bus system is extensive and is valid for 90 minutes. You can buy your tickets at newsstands (chiosco). One day ticket from €0.90.

Genova has a new subway system, indicated by a red M. Currently with seven stops. Automatic ticket machines in all the stations, valid for 90 minutes or the whole day.

In addition to the funicular, Genova also has elevators for locals who live uphill. There are a number of these around the city, and the standard AMT tickets are valid. Price from €3.
