Each year, over 50,000 people relocate permanently to this city thanks to the abundance of jobs, low taxes, healthy climate and beautiful surroundings. With 320 days of sunshine annually, Las Vegas can also boast of some of the best golfing facilities in the country.

Beyond the famous five-mile Las Vegas Strip, there are also the historic and exciting Fremont Street, home of the original casinos that started the Vegas craze back in the 1930s. Millions of tourists come to see the Freemont Experience—an incredible and breathtaking light and sound show presented on a domed structure covering several blocks in the downtown area.

It is impossible to see and do everything that Las Vegas has to offer in one trip, which is what keeps visitors returning over and over again. The choices can be overwhelming. Good planning is the key to any great vacation, but that is especially the case here.

Grand Canyon National Park

Pretty much everyone has heard of the Grand Canyon! The stunning landscape with its impressive size is a sight that should not be missed if you are anywhere near it. The national park consists of 277 miles (446 km) of the Colorado River and the erosion's effects on the surrounding landscape. The Grand Canyon is 18 miles (29 km) wide, and a mile (1,6 km) deep. It is possible to hike 9 miles (14,5 km) down the Bright Angel Trail all the way to the bottom

More Info: The Grand Canyon lies 250 miles from Las Vegas. There are several companies that offer day trips and different tours out there. If you have a car and want to drive there yourself, you take highway 93 south to Interstate 40 east to highway 64. Count on approximately 4.5 hours to get there.

Gambling

There is no doubt that the main attraction in Las Vegas is gambling. There is a level of gambling for every visitor, whether experienced or a first-timer. If you are new to gaming, most casinos offer free lessons, usually in the

morning hours on table games such as Blackjack, Craps, and Roulette. The new penny slots are probably the most popular with the recreational gambler because of the bonus games within the games. The jackpots are, of course, not nearly as large as dollar slots, but the games are fun and entertaining: there is money to be won!

More Info: The 21-year age limit for all gambling is strictly enforced.

Hoover Dam

The Hoover Dam, once known as Boulder Dam, is a concrete arch-gravity dam on the border between Arizona and Nevada. Named after President Herbert Hoover and dedicated by President Franklin Roosevelt, the Hoover Dam is visited by nearly one million people each year. Hoover Dam is a national historic landmark and the highest concrete dam in the Western Hemisphere, more than 725 feet (220 m) above the Colorado River. It has 17 generators that produce 4 billion kilowatts of electricity a year, which makes it one of the country's largest hydroelectric power facilities.

Fountains of Bellagio

The Bellagio Fountains, a choreographed dance of water and light set to 29 different operas, country, or pop musical selections, is presented at the quarter-mile lake in front of the Hotel Bellagio. Each show is different and lasts five to 10 minutes, with the water blasted hundreds of feet into the sky. Shows take place every 30 minutes from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. and every 15 minutes from 8 p.m. to midnight. The best time to see the fountains is at night and to stand on the street side of the lake. Crowds will start to gather about five minutes before each show so get there a little early to get an unobstructed view.

Death Valley National Park

Death Valley is a hot, low, and dry desert valley within the Mojave desert, east of the Sierra Mountains. It holds the record for the hottest July temperature ever recorded at Furnace Creek. On July 10, 1913, temperatures reached a stunning 134 °F (56.7 °C). Death Valley has an area of about 3,000 square miles (7.800 km²) and is located near the border of California and Nevada.

Fremont Street Experience

The Fremont Street Experience is a highly successful attempt to draw the millions of visitors to Las Vegas back to the downtown area. A domed-canopy 90 feet (27,5 meters) above the street was constructed along five city blocks lined with some of the oldest casinos in Las Vegas. Every evening from sundown to midnight, the canopy becomes a giant screen showing high resolution images accompanied by concert-quality sound. At the top of each hour, visitors pour into the streets, looking skyward in anticipation of one of the six different shows lasting six to nine minutes.

Numerous Airport Shuttles are available 24 hours a day. Round trip to and from any hotel on the strip is \$12 per person or \$6.50 one way. Off-strip is slightly higher. Shuttles can take up to 40 minutes to get you to your hotel.

There are over 100 different tours offered by a variety of tour companies in Las Vegas including sightseeing to the Hoover Dam, Grand Canyon, Lake Mead and the Colorado River, Red Rock and the Valley of Fire and Mt. Charleston. These tours last from 2 to 10 hours, and can be by van, bus, airplane, boat or helicopter. For complete listings and detailed descriptions go to: www.vegas.com/tours. Be sure to book tours from a reputable company, not from someone selling tours on the street.

One of the most exciting tours is the Grand Canyon Sunset Tour. Leave by helicopter, making a low-level flight over the Hoover Dam and Lake Mead and land at the Grand Canyon for a Champagne picnic at sunset before you return over the lights of the Las Vegas Strip.

Approximate cost \$450 per person.

If you have a car, it is an easy drive from the Las Vegas Strip to the Hoover Dam and Lake Mead (51 km/31 miles) Mt. Charleston (64 km/40 miles) Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area (24 km/15 miles) and the Valley of Fire (85 km/53 miles).

What to pack

Except for a special evening of dinner and dancing, visitors to Las Vegas dress very casually. Be sure to bring comfortable shoes. Ladies, don't carry a large purse, it will only get in the way when you are gambling. Bring a "fanny pack" to carry identification, credit cards and money. Don't forget the swimming suits. Always carry proper identification with you, especially when gambling.

Getting the best deal

All hotels offer special rates on their websites. Many also offer two-for-one shows and free buffets.

Player's Cards

Every casino will offer a Player's Card. Cards are free and it takes about 5 minutes to complete a short application.

You will need a drivers' license or another form of identification.

Every time you play a slot machine, insert the card into the appropriate slot and it will track the amount of play. The longer you play, the more credits you will receive. You can also get credit on your card for table games. Simply hand the card to the Dealer, and they will add credits depending on the amount you play.

These credits accumulate and can be used for small gifts, free meals and even free nights. Some cards cover multiple casinos and you can use it at any venue listed on



the card. Even if you are only playing penny slots, these credits add up. Don't worry if you lose your card—all the information is in their computers, and they will gladly issue you a new card at no charge.

Arriving at the hotel

Even though most hotel websites state that check-in is at 3 p.m., you can generally check in at any time, as long as rooms are available. There are many flights arriving in the morning and early afternoon, and the hotels try their best to accommodate their guests.

In the event the hotel is crowded and rooms have not been cleaned from the previous night, they will hold your luggage in a secure room (for a small fee) until your room is ready, leaving you free to explore the hotel and casino. Credit cards are widely accepted: Visa, MasterCard, American express, Discover, Diner's Club, EnRoute, EuroCard and JCB.

Buying half-price show tickets

Tickets Tonight is located at the giant Coca Cola Bottle on the Las Vegas Strip, next to MGM Grand and across from New York and sells same-day show tickets for half price. Open from noon to 9 p.m., they accept credit cards or cash, and all purchases must be made in person—no telephone orders are accepted. The chances of finding the headlining performers, such as Bette Midler or Elton John are not very good, but there are many terrific shows that may be available.

Warnings/Tourist Traps

Pornography Peddlers: As you walk along the Strip, there are people who will try to hand you cards or tacky leaflets. Do not accept anything from them, just keep walking.

Time Share Sales: Outside casinos on the Strip, there will be nicely-dressed men or women with one mission—to get tourists to give up a half day of their vacation to listen to a time share sales pitch. They will offer free show tickets or dinner tickets. Their first question is always "How long will

you be in Vegas?" A good response is to say that you are leaving in just a few hours, and they immediately leave you alone.
