THE CITY

New York City may be small in size, but it's huge in numbers. It's the most densely populated city in North America with 8 million citizens on just 830 square kilometers of land.

It has always been a city of immigrants, and, even today, about one-third of its citizens are foreign-born. Roughly 138 languages are spoken here, and vibrant new ethnic enclaves pop up all over the city, offering visitors a vast array of interesting cultural and culinary experiences.

While the city pulses with the blood of its newest residents, old New York is still alive and well. Opera still bursts from the venerable stage of Lincoln Center. Wall Street, the hive of capitalism, still bustles with the excitement and tension of the stock market. And the stately apartments of New York's wealthy still frame the majestic Central Park.

Usually when people speak of New York they mean Manhattan, but New York City is made up of five boroughs: The Bronx, Brooklyn, Manhattan, Queens and Staten Island. Visitors with a little extra time on their hands should at least pay a visit to Brooklyn with the hipster headquarters in Williamsburg, and stroll along memories of the olden days at the Coney Island boardwalk.

New York has become one of America's safest cities, and the best way to see it is to walk. Numbered streets in Manhattan make navigation easy and run from east to west, avenues intersect from north to south (uptown and downtown).

New Yorkers are—contrary to their reputation—friendly and talkative, and nearly every night of the week the city's bars and clubs are crowded with revelers. There are several universities in New York, which contribute to keeping the city fresh and young.

You'll never run out of things to do in New York. Hitting all of the major sights in one trip requires ambition—but, hey, New Yorkers are ambitious, if nothing else. Choose between visiting the Metropolitan Museum of Art, taking a stroll in Central Park, making a trip to Ellis Island to see the stately Statue of Liberty, popping in to see the squid and the whale at the Museum of Natural History, experiencing a Papaya hot dog, seeing a Broadway show, or, going on a "Sex and the City" tour.

Statue of Liberty / Ellis Island



The Statue of Liberty was a gift to the United States from the French in 1886. The robed female represents the Roman goddess of freedom, she holds a torch and a tabula ansata

with the inscribed date of the American Declaration of Independence. When immigrants arrived by boat in the late 19th century, the first sight they saw was the Statue of Liberty–an enduring symbol of the American dream.



JFK International Airport

New York is served by three major airports and JFK is maybe the most known one of them all. You can take public transportation or taxis to Manhattan from all airports. There is a flat-rate taxi fare from JFK to Manhattan, but there are also subway and public transport options. You find a car at a taxi rank outside each terminal building.The flat rate start at \$52.

To reach the stops for public transport, you need to use the AirTrain in most cases.

The metro from JFK to Midtown Manhattan takes approx.60-75 minutes and costs from \$2.50.

There are also different bus services. The local transport company MTA operates three different lines going to nearby neighborhoods. The fare is the same as for the metro.

The NYC Airporter is a direct bus line from JFK to Grand Central Station and Penn Station. A single ticket costs \$16 and the journey takes approx. 60 minutes depending on traffic. You can buy tickets online or at the NYC Airporter counter inside the airport.

Newark International Airport

Newark International Airport is located in New Jersey and from here you can choose to take a taxi, train or bus to go to the city.

If taxi is your choice of transport, you will find cars waiting outside the arrival hall. The fare from Newark to Manhattan starts at \$50 and it takes from 35 minutes to reach New York City.

There is an AirTrain, transporting passengers from the arrival hall to the trains (NJ TRANSIT or Amtrak train) and the ticket for the AirTrain costs \$5.50. It takes approx. 45

minutes from the airport to Penn station and the fee is \$11.55 one way.

The Newark Airport Express Bus costs \$16 one way or \$28 round trip. The journey takes about 50 minutes and it stops at Grand Central Station, Bryant Park and Port Authority Bus Terminal.

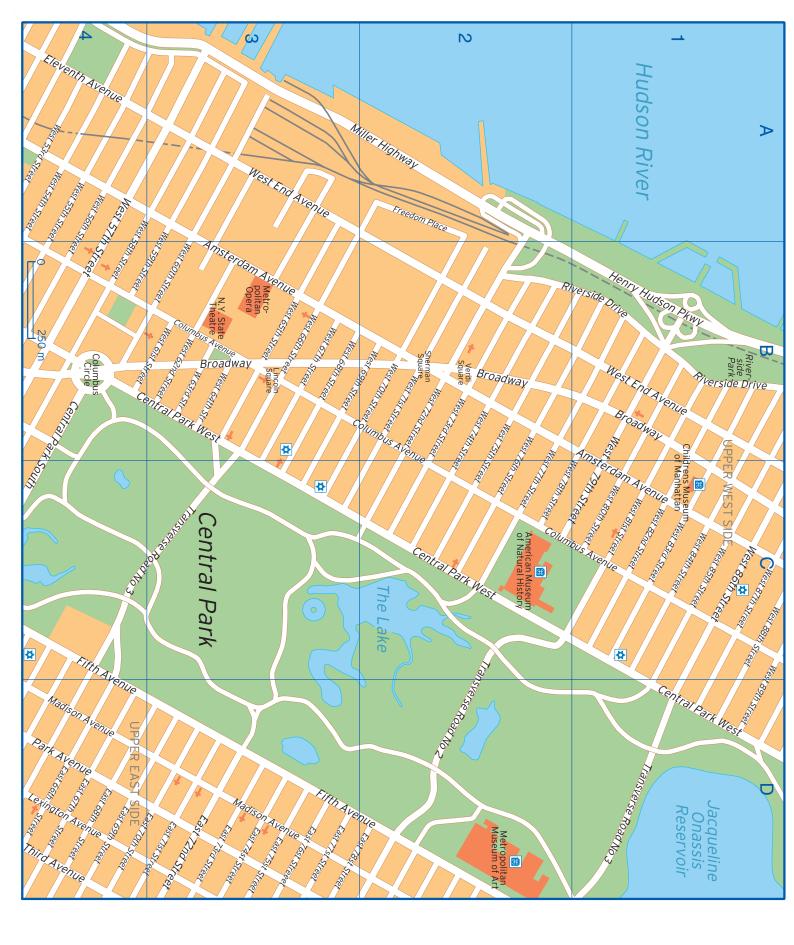

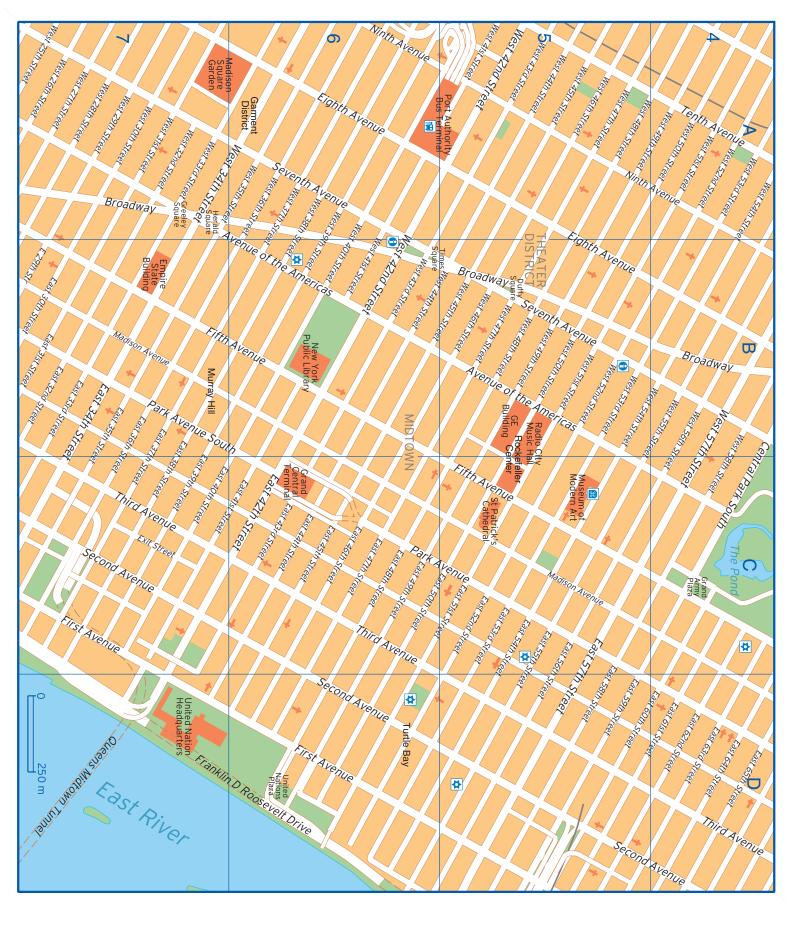

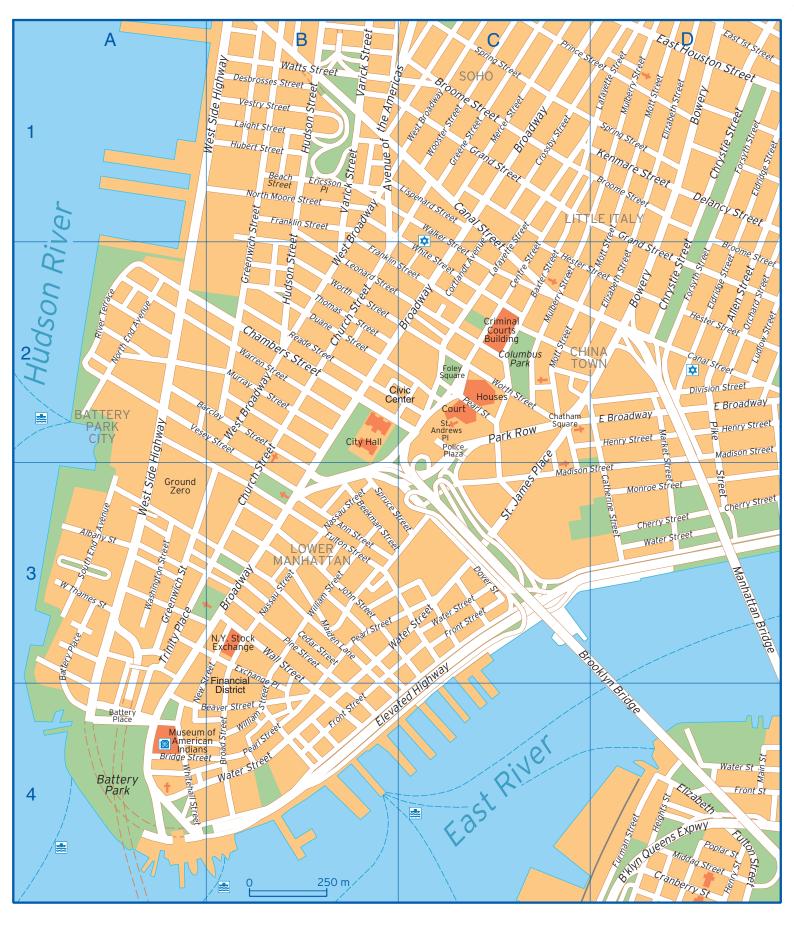
